Council President Opseth asked for discussion. There was none. Roll was called on the motion with the following results. Council Members voting aye: Kuntz, Jerred, McGrath, Rothleutner, Carter-King, and Council President Opseth. The Presiding Officer declared the motion carried.

It was moved by Councilwoman Carter-King and seconded by Councilman Rothleutner to approve a professional services agreement for construction management services associated with the 2012 Water and Sanitary Sewer Main Replacement Project with HDR Engineering, Inc., in the amount of \$259,112. Council President Opseth asked for discussion. There was none. Roll was called on the motion with the following results. Council Members voting aye: Jerred, McGrath, Rothleutner, Carter-King, Kuntz, and Council President Opseth. The Presiding Officer declared the motion carried.

It was moved by Councilman Rothleutner and seconded by Councilman Jerred to approve a bid award for the PMS 2013 Schedule B Project to Powder River Construction, Inc., in the amount of \$847,126.

Council President Opseth asked for background information. City Administrator Napier explained the project. He stated there were five bids received for the project and the engineer's estimate was \$1,002,550. After the discussion, roll was called on the motion with the following results. Council Members voting aye: McGrath, Rothleutner, Carter-King, Kuntz, Jerred, and Council President Opseth. The Presiding Officer declared the motion carried.

It was moved by Councilwoman Carter-King and seconded by Councilman Kuntz to approve a bid award for the PMS 2013 Schedule C Project to include the base bid and additive alternates 1 and 2, to Powder River Construction, Inc., in the amount of \$889,176.50. Council President Opseth asked for background information. City Administrator Napier explained the project and said there were six bids received for the project and the engineer's estimate was \$1,153,882.50. After the discussion, roll was called on the motion with the following results. Council Members voting aye: Rothleutner, Carter-King, Kuntz, Jerred, McGrath, and Council President Opseth. The Presiding Officer declared the motion carried.

It was moved by Councilwoman Carter-King and seconded by Councilman McGrath to approve a bid award for the base bid of the Enzi Drive Landscaping Project to G&G Landscaping, Inc., in the amount of \$189,000. Council President Opseth asked for discussion. There was none. Roll was called on the motion with the following results. Council Members voting aye: Carter-King, Kuntz, Jerred, McGrath, Rothleutner, and Council President Opseth. The Presiding Officer declared the motion carried.

It was moved by Councilwoman Carter-King and seconded by Councilman Rothleutner to approve a professional services agreement for the construction management associated with the PMS 2013 Schedule C Project with Morrison-Maierle, Inc., in the amount of \$104,766. Council President Opseth asked for discussion. There was none. Roll was called on the motion with the following results. Council Members voting aye: Kuntz, Jerred, McGrath, Rothleutner, Carter-King, and Council President Opseth. The Presiding Officer declared the motion carried.

It was moved by Councilman Rothleutner and seconded by Councilwoman Carter-King to approve a professional services agreement for construction management associated with the PMS 2013 Schedule B Project with HDR Engineering, Inc., in the amount of \$105,928. Council President Opseth asked for discussion. There was none. Roll was called on the motion with the following results. Council Members voting aye: Jerred, McGrath, Rothleutner, Carter-King, Kuntz, and Council President Opseth. The Presiding Officer declared the motion carried.

Albertson's #2067 to Albertson's, LLC, d.b.a. Albertson's #2067. Council President Opseth asked for discussion. Councilwoman Carter-King asked if they were only changing their name. City Administrator Napier stated there are a number of Albertson's throughout the state of Wyoming going through the same process in regards to changes within their corporate structure; this is consistent with what is taking place throughout the state. After the discussion, roll was called on the motion with the following results. Council Members voting aye: McGrath, Rothleutner, Carter-King, Kuntz, Jerred, and Council President Opseth. The Presiding Officer declared the motion carried.
