



Proclamation

- WHEREAS*, Coach Mike Curry was the Head Coach of the Campbell County High School Boys Basketball Team since 1983. He has strengthened the Campbell County High School Basketball Program and enhanced its reputation locally and nationally through his leadership, vision and integrity; and
- WHEREAS*, in 2011, Coach Curry was named “Coach of the Year” by the National High School Coaches Association and Wyoming 4A Boys’ Basketball Coach of the Year 11 times; and
- WHEREAS*, for three decades, Mike Curry has led one of the most successful boys’ basketball programs, amassing a truly remarkable record, however, Curry feels the real measure of his success is not just how well his players learned to win on the basketball court, but how they learned to succeed in life; and
- WHEREAS*, Coach Mike Curry’s list of accomplishments stretches longer than most in Wyoming with over 600 career wins. The Camels won 12 State Championships, 10 within a 13-year span since 1990 and ending with a title in 2002, including titles won in 2008 and 2011 with Curry. The Camels also won 19 Wyoming 4A Regional Tournament Championships and 22 EWAC and NWAC 4A Conference Championships; and
- WHEREAS*, Coach Curry is recognized around Wyoming by numerous people but there is more to him than just his basketball records. He is an all round successful person because of his three strongest characteristics; being a hard worker, a positive role model, and a caring person. The quote he lives by is “Life is a journey not a destination;” and
- WHEREAS*, Mike Curry and his wife, Janice, have two children, Graydon and Marissa.
