The Presiding Officer declared the motion carried.

### New Business

It was moved by Councilman Opseth and seconded by Councilman McGrath to approve a street closure requested by Record Supply, Inc., for the 100th block of Emerson Avenue, July 16-19, from 7:00 a.m. to 6:00 p.m. for their Annual Tool Sale. Mayor Murphy asked for an explanation of the request. Acting City Administrator Boger explained the closure. She went on to say that the closure will only affect one business, and that business has been notified. After the discussion, roll was called on the motion with the following results. Council Members voting aye: Rothleutner, Carter-King, Kuntz, Jerred, McGrath, Opseth, and Mayor Murphy. The Presiding Officer declared the motion carried.

It was moved by Councilwoman Carter-King and seconded by Councilman Jerred to approve a bid award for the Annual Streets Maintenance Project to Black Cat Construction, LLC, in the amount of \$505,000. It was moved by Council President Opseth and seconded by Councilwoman Carter-King to amend the verbiage in the bid award to read "not to exceed \$505,000". Mayor Murphy asked for discussion. There was none. Roll was called on the motion to amend with the following results. Council Members voting aye: Kuntz, Jerred, McGrath, Opseth, Rothleutner, Carter-King, and Mayor Murphy. The Presiding Officer declared the motion carried and the verbiage in the bid award will read "not to exceed \$505,000." Roll was called on the original motion with the following results. Council Members voting aye: Carter-King, Kuntz, Jerred, McGrath, Opseth, Rothleutner, and Mayor Murphy. The Presiding Officer declared the motion carried.

It was moved by Councilman Kuntz and seconded by Councilman McGrath to accept public improvements for the County Club Road Improvements Project, installed by Powder River Construction, Inc., in the amount of \$1,541,107.04. Mayor Murphy asked for discussion. There was none. Roll was called on the motion with the following results. Council Members voting aye: Jerred, McGrath, Opseth, Rothleutner, Carter-King, Kuntz, and Mayor Murphy. The Presiding Officer declared the motion carried.

It was moved by Councilwoman Carter-King and seconded by Councilman Opseth to approve a bid award for the City West Parking Lot Landscaping Project to G&G Landscape, Inc., in the amount of \$72,145. Mayor Murphy asked for an explanation of the request. Acting City Administrator Boger explained what is included in the landscaping project and went on to say that the bid came in lower than the engineer's estimate by \$4,000. Councilman Jerred asked if Xeriscape will be used for a majority of the project. Ms. Boger affirmed that was correct. After the discussion, roll was called on the motion with the following results. Council Members voting aye: McGrath, Opseth, Rothleutner, Carter-King, Kuntz, Jerred, and Mayor Murphy. The Presiding Officer declared the motion carried.

#### RESOLUTION 2418

It was moved by Councilman Jerred and seconded by Councilman McGrath to approve the foregoing Resolution approving and authorizing the final plat for the resubdivision of Lot 16, Industrial Park East Subdivision, to the City of Gillette, Wyoming, subject to all Planning requirements. Mayor Murphy asked for discussion. There was none. Roll was called on the motion with the following results. Council Members voting aye: Opseth, Rothleutner, Carter-King, Kuntz, Jerred, McGrath, and Mayor Murphy. The Presiding Officer declared the motion carried.

#### RESOLUTION 2419

##### A RESOLUTION APPROVING AND AUTHORIZING THE FINAL PLAT FOR THE LAKELAND HILLS SUBDIVISION, PHASE IV, TO THE CITY OF GILLETTE, WYOMING, SUBJECT TO ALL PLANNING REQUIREMENTS

It was moved by Councilman Opseth and seconded by Councilman Jerred to approve the foregoing Resolution approving and authorizing the final plat for the Lakeland Hills Subdivision, Phase IV, to the City of Gillette, Wyoming, subject to all Planning requirements. Mayor Murphy asked for discussion. There was none. Roll was called on the motion with the following results. Council Members voting aye: Rothleutner, Carter-King, Kuntz, Jerred, McGrath, Opseth, and Mayor Murphy. The Presiding Officer declared the motion carried.

It was moved by Councilman Opseth and seconded by Councilman McGrath to approve a bid award to include the Base Bid and Additive Alternate, for the Dalbey Little League Pathway Project, to Powder River Construction, Inc., in the amount of \$76,974.25. Mayor Murphy asked for an explanation of the request. Acting City Administrator Boger explained what the project consists of, and went on to say that the bid came in lower than the engineer's estimate by approximately \$44,000. After the discussion, roll was called on the motion with the following results. Council Members voting aye: Carter-King, Kuntz, Jerred, McGrath, Opseth, Rothleutner, and Mayor Murphy. The Presiding Officer declared the motion carried.

It was moved by Councilman Rothleutner and seconded by Councilman Kuntz to approve a bid award for the Westover Road Zone 2 Water Transmission Replacement Project to DRM, Inc., in the amount of \$2,154,981.13. Mayor Murphy asked for an explanation of the request. Acting City Administrator Boger explained the project and stated that the bid came in lower than the engineer's estimate. Utilities Manager Peterson informed the Council two-way traffic will be maintained during the construction of this project. After the discussion, roll was called on the motion with the following results. Council Members voting aye: Kuntz, Jerred, McGrath, Opseth, Rothleutner, Carter-King, and Mayor Murphy. The Presiding Officer declared the motion carried.

#### Appointments

It was moved by Council President Opseth and seconded by Councilwoman Carter-King to appoint Don McKillop, Jr. (three year term); Duane Evenson, (four year term); and Shaun Gee (five year term) to the Madison Regional Water Panel. Mayor Murphy asked for an explanation of the process used for the selection of panel members. Water Services Manager Monahan explained the application and selection process and went on to explain the panel member's responsibilities. After the discussion, roll was called on the motion with the following results. Council Members voting aye: Jerred, McGrath, Opseth, Rothleutner, Carter-King, Kuntz, and Mayor Murphy. The Presiding Officer declared the motion carried.

#### Administrator's Report

Mayor Murphy asked for an Administrator's Report. Acting City Administrator Boger reminded the Council and the public that City offices will be closed on Thursday, July 4th, in observance of Independence Day.

#### Special Orders of the Day

Mayor Murphy opened into a public hearing to receive input on the sale of used property to the Town of Upton. Mayor Murphy asked City Attorney Anderson to give background information on this request. City Attorney Anderson explained that negotiations between Fleet Manager Martin and Upton's Fire Chief took place concerning a 2002 Ford F550 diesel engine fire truck. Staff is recommending the sale of this piece of equipment. George Bondora, representing the Town of Upton, thanked the Council for their consideration of this sale. After the discussion, Mayor Murphy closed the public hearing.

#### RESOLUTION 2420

#### A RESOLUTION TO AUTHORIZE A SALE OF USED PROPERTY TO THE TOWN OF UPTON, WYOMING, FOLLOWING A PUBLIC HEARING ADVERTISED IN A PUBLISHED NOTICE

It was moved by Councilwoman Carter-King and seconded by Councilman Kuntz to approve the foregoing Resolution to authorize a sale of used property to the Town of Upton, Wyoming. Mayor Murphy asked for further discussion. There was none. Roll was called on the motion with the following results. Council Members voting aye: McGrath, Opseth, Rothleutner, Carter-King, Kuntz, Jerred, and Mayor Murphy. The Presiding Officer declared the motion carried.
