AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND SECTION 3-3 OF THE GILLETTE CITY CODE TO EXTEND THE REQUIREMENT OF ALCOHOL SERVER TRAINING TO ALL ALCOHOL SERVER STAFF

It was moved by Councilman Kuntz and seconded by Councilman McGrath to approve the foregoing Ordinance on first reading. Council President Opseth asked for an explanation of the request. City Administrator Napier explained that this Ordinance would expand the scope of the training that is required to include all server staff and managers, and include all liquor establishments, not just restaurants. After the explanation, roll was called on the motion with the following results. Council Members voting aye: Rothleutner, Carter-King, Kuntz, Jerred, McGrath, and Council President Opseth. The Presiding Officer declared the motion carried.

New Business

It was moved by Councilwoman Carter-King and seconded by Councilman McGrath to approve the Girls Residential Treatment Facility Project Memorandum of Understanding with Campbell County and Youth Emergency Services, Inc. Council President Opseth asked for discussion. There was none. Roll was called on the motion with the following results. Council Members voting aye: Carter-King, Kuntz, Jerred, McGrath, Rothleutner, and Council President Opseth. The Presiding Officer declared the motion carried.

RESOLUTION NO.2439

A RESOLUTION TO APPROVE A DELEGATION AGREEMENT BY AND BETWEEN THE WYOMING DEPARTMENT OF ENVIRONMENTAL QUALITY AND CITY OF GILLETTE, WYOMING, PURSUANT TO §35-11-304(a) W.S. 1977, AND DESIGNATING THE CITY ENGINEER AS THE DELEGATED LOCAL OFFICAL.

It was moved by Councilman Rothleutner and seconded by Councilman McGrath to approve the foregoing Resolution to approve a delegation agreement by and between the Wyoming Department of Environmental Quality and the City of Gillette, Wyoming, pursuant to Section 35-11-304(a) W.S. 1977, and designating the City Engineer as the delegated local official. Council President Opseth asked for an explanation of the request. City Administrator Napier explained that the relationship between DEQ and the City is such, that DEQ has delegated their review authority to the City so that any public utilities that are constructed can be approved by the City, versus having to go through DEQ for the authorization. The basic nature of that agreement will continue upon passage of this agreement. The major changes are more in line with some of the outdated exhibits and other items within the agreement that needed updating. The agreement specifies that private utilities constructed, that won't come under the ownership of the City, will have to seek authority of the DEQ. After the discussion, roll was called on the motion with the following results. Council Members voting aye: Kuntz, Jerred, McGrath, Rothleutner, Carter-King, and Council President Opseth. The Presiding Officer declared the motion carried.

It was moved by Councilwoman Carter-King and seconded by Councilman Kuntz to approve a Memorandum of Understanding between the Gillette Police Department and the Northern Wyoming Community College Police Department. Council President Opseth asked for an explanation of the request. City Administrator Napier explained that this agreement memorializes the agreement between the Gillette Police and the Campus Police, allowing the Campus Police to issue citations that would be heard in Municipal Court. After the explanation, roll was called on the motion with the following results. Council Members voting aye: Jerred, McGrath, Rothleutner, Carter-King, Kuntz, and Council President Opseth. The Presiding Officer declared the motion carried.

It was moved by Councilman Rothleutner and seconded by Councilwoman Carter-King to approve an amendment authorizing the Mayor to sign on behalf of the City of Gillette, Amendment Three to the City's Schedule J Power Supply Contract with the Municipal Energy Agency of Nebraska. Council President Opseth asked for discussion. There was none. Roll was called on the motion with the following results. Council Members voting aye: McGrath, Rothleutner, Carter-King, Kuntz, Jerred, and Council President Opseth. The Presiding Officer declared the motion carried.

RESOLUTION 2440

A RESOLUTION APPROVING AND AUTHORIZING THE FINAL PLAT FOR LOTS 2A & 2B, SUNRISE ADDITION TO THE CITY OF GILLETTE, WYOMING, SUBJECT TO ALL PLANNING REQUIREMENTS

It was moved by Councilwoman Carter-King and seconded by Councilman McGrath to approve the foregoing Resolution approving and authorizing the final plat for Lots 2A and 2B, Sunrise Addition to the City of Gillette, Wyoming, subject to all Planning requirements. Council President Opseth asked for an explanation of the request. City Administrator Napier explained that one lot will be subdivided into two lots, and they are located east of the Club Energize Facility. After some discussion, roll was called on the motion with the following results. Council Members voting aye: Rothleutner, Carter-King, Kuntz, Jerred, McGrath, and Council President Opseth. The Presiding Officer declared the motion carried.

Administrator's Report

Council President Opseth asked for an Administrator's report. City Administrator Napier replied he had nothing to report.

Special Orders of the Day

Council President Opseth opened into a public hearing to solicit citizen views, comments and recommendations regarding a Community Facilities Grant Program Grant Application by the City of Gillette to the Wyoming Business Council, for the Boys and Girls Club of Campbell County. City Administrator Napier opened the discussion to give background information. The idea is the City, as the applicant, would approach the Business Council through Community Facilities Program to take ownership of the old Lakeview School and make it available for a tenant relationship with the Boys & Girls Club. The request is for \$1,000,000 to provide improvements to the building so it can accommodate the needs of the Boys & Girls Club. The match is being proposed to be provided by the Boys & Girls Club, and not the City of Gillette. The City's exposure in regards to this relationship would be in the ownership of the building, and provide the building on a landlord basis. Mr. Napier went on to say that if the application is not successful, the City will not retain ownership of the building, and the building would be given directly to the Boys & Girls Club from the School District, leaving the City out of the picture. Karla Brandenburg, Board Member, shared the progress and plans of the Boys & Girls Club and the success rate in Campbell County. She informed the group that their plan is to rent a portion of the building as well. Councilwoman Carter-King asked if they could rent to other businesses since they were applying for a grant. Ms. Brandenburg replied that since the grant is for a community facilities building, the Business Council would find it more favorable if other organizations in the community could utilize the building as well. Councilwoman Carter-King asked if the other businesses were youth related, or could any business occupy the building with the Boys & Girls Club. Ms. Brandenburg replied that it could be other businesses, however, that is not who they would be renting to. She went on to say that they would be renting to other youth related businesses. Councilman McGrath asked if the Boys & Girls Club was not successful in obtaining the full amount, would they still be able to retain a portion of the building. Ms. Brandenburg stated that they plan on keeping the building regardless. Councilman Jerred asked if the Boys & Girls Club Organization provides any type of funding or support. Brandenburg replied the Organization provides program funding; but no operational funding. After the discussion, Council President Opseth closed the public hearing.

It was moved by Councilwoman Carter-King and seconded by Councilman McGrath to approve the foregoing Resolution to authorize an application for a Community Facilities Grant Program Grant for the Boys and Girls Club of Campbell County and approve the Lakeview School Site Memorandum of Understanding with the Boys & Girls Club of Campbell County and the Campbell County School District. Council President Opseth asked for further discussion. There was none. Roll was called on the motion with the following results. Council

Members voting aye: Carter-King, Kuntz, Jerred, McGrath, Rothleutner, and Council President Opseth. The Presiding Officer declared the motion carried.

Council President Opseth opened into a public hearing for a zoning map amendment for Lot 3, Block 1, Bivens Addition, from R-2, Single and Two Family Residential District, to C-1, General Commercial District. No comments were made and Council President Opseth closed the public hearing.
