Councilman Jerred and Mayor Opseth also reported that they will be out of town and not attending the Visioning Meeting. ## Campbell County Conservation District

Tim Morrison, District Manager for Campbell County Conservation District, explained that the Conservation District functions consist of water quality monitoring and environmental education, and stated that the District will be requesting possible funding from the City for FY2015. Mr. Morrison gave a brief description in regard to each function, and stated that the Conservation District Board of Supervisors will be requesting funding from the City Council in the amount of \$20,000 for water quality monitoring and \$10,000 for environmental education. He went on to say that the County currently funds the Conservation District from the 1% sales tax revenues and also obtains grants from state and federal resources.
