It was moved by Councilman Jerred and seconded by Councilman Rothleutner to approve the Consent Agenda. Mayor Opseth asked for discussion. There was none. Roll was called on the motion with the following results. Council Members voting aye: Carter-King, Jerred, Kuntz, McGrath, Rothleutner, Carsrud, and Mayor Opseth. The Presiding Officer declared the motion carried.

Approval of Conflict Claims

It was moved by Councilman Jerred and seconded by Councilman Rothleutner to approve a conflict claim for Councilwoman Carter-King in the amount of \$2,045.65 to Powder River Office Supply. Mayor Opseth asked for discussion. There was none. Roll was called on the motion with the following results. Council Members voting aye: Jerred, Kuntz, McGrath, Rothleutner, Carsrud, and Mayor Opseth. Councilwoman Carter-King abstained. The Presiding Officer declared the motion carried.

It was moved by Councilwoman Carter-King and seconded by Councilman Kuntz to approve a conflict claim for Councilman Rothleutner in the amount of \$109.75 to Mike's Hardware. Mayor Opseth asked for discussion. There was none. Roll was called on the motion with the following results. Council Members voting aye: Kuntz, McGrath, Carsrud, Carter-King, Jerred, and Mayor Opseth. Councilman Rothleutner abstained. The Presiding Officer declared the motion carried.

Oral Comments - For the Good of the Community

Mayor Opseth proclaimed the month of January as "Stalking Awareness Month." Brandy Matteson, Director of Victim Services, explained the proclamation.

The Mayor and Council recognized Justin Strub and Delbert Parks for their years of service as Citizen Advisory Board Members for the Board of Examiners.

Councilwoman Carter-King informed the public that a letter was received from the Wyoming Department of Transportation in regard to a request the City of Gillette had made for the installation of a traffic signal at the intersection of Highway 50 and 4-J Road. She went on to say that WYDOT intends to widen the highway and at that time would be installing a permanent signal; however, this won't be done until 2019. WYDOT agrees that a signal is needed at this intersection, and, therefore, will install a temporary signal by late summer/early fall of this year. Councilwoman Carter-King went on to thank staff and the citizens who were involved, bringing this issue to fruition.

Public Comments

Mayor Opseth asked for public comments. There were none.

Council Reports

Mayor Opseth asked for Council reports. There were none.

Written Comments

Mayor Opseth asked for written comments. City Clerk Abelseth reported that a banking disclosure form was received from Councilman Carsrud for the remainder of FY 2013/2014.

New Business - General Agenda

It was moved by Councilman Rothleutner and seconded by Councilman Jerred to approve a professional services agreement for design and bidding services associated with the WWTF Drainage Replacement Project with Morrison-Maierle in the amount of \$54,309. Mayor Opseth asked for an explanation of the request. City Administrator Napier explained that this is a request for the replacement of floor drains within three (3) buildings located at the Wastewater Treatment Facility, as well as the floor within the Dewatering Unit Building. He went on to say there was a budgeted amount of \$100,000 placed in this year's budget to cover the costs associated with a design and bidding services agreement. After the explanation, roll was called on the motion with the following results. Council Members voting aye: McGrath, Rothleutner, Carsrud, Carter-King, Jerred, Kuntz, and Mayor Opseth. The Presiding Officer declared the motion carried.

It was moved by Councilman Rothleutner and seconded by Councilwoman Carter-King to approve a bid award for the 2013 Water Main Replacement Project to DRM, Inc., in the amount of \$989,081.65. Mayor Opseth asked for an explanation of the request. City Administrator Napier explained the streets involved and went on to report that the award is considerably less than the engineer's estimate of \$1,578,030. There were five (5) bids submitted for the project and DRM, Inc., is the apparent low bidder. After the explanation, roll was called on the motion with the following results. Council Members voting aye: Rothleutner, Carsrud, Carter-King, Jerred, Kuntz, McGrath, and Mayor Opseth. The Presiding Officer declared the motion carried.

It was moved Councilman Rothleutner and seconded by Councilman Jerred to accept public improvements for the City West Heated Vehicle Storage Building Project, as constructed by S&S Builders, LLC, in the amount of \$1,896,373.28. Mayor Opseth asked for discussion. Councilman Jerred asked what the original estimate was for the project. City Administrator Napier stated that the estimate precipitated a budget amount of \$3,000,000. Because of the savings from the heated vehicle storage building, money was available to complete the HVAC project at City Hall. After the discussion, roll was called on the motion with the following results. Council Members voting aye: Carsrud, Carter-King, Jerred, Kuntz, McGrath, Rothleutner, and Mayor Opseth. The Presiding Officer declared the motion carried.

It was moved by Councilman Jerred and seconded by Councilman Rothleutner to approve a professional services agreement for design and construction management services associated with the YES House Girls Residential Treatment Facility with Noel Griffith Jr. and Associates Architects, in the amount of \$237,300. Mayor Opseth asked for discussion. There was none. Roll was called on the motion with the following results. Council Members voting aye: Carter-King, Jerred, Kuntz, McGrath, Rothleutner, Carsrud, and Mayor Opseth. The Presiding Officer declared the motion carried.

It was moved by Councilwoman Carter-King and seconded by Councilman Rothleutner to accept subdivision improvements for the Legacy Ridge Subdivision, Phase II, installed by PS Services, LLC, and Powder River Construction, Inc., on behalf of the developer, Quantum Partners, LLC. Mayor Opseth asked for discussion. There was none. Roll was called on the motion with the following results. Council Members voting aye: Jerred, Kuntz, McGrath, Rothleutner, Carsrud, Carter-King, and Mayor Opseth. The Presiding Officer declared the motion carried.

It was moved by Councilman Jerred and seconded by Councilwoman Carter-King to pre-qualify general contractors for formal bidding purposes for the Gillette Avenue Improvements Project. Mayor Opseth asked for a list of the contractors. City Administrator Napier stated that based on the information provided, HDR determined the following to be qualified bidders: Concrete Works of Colorado, Inc.; DRM, Inc.; Interstate Highway Construction, Inc.; North Star Energy & Construction, LLC; and S&S Builders. Councilwoman Carter-King asked City Administrator Napier for a report in regard to the grant request. Mr. Napier stated that the grant was awarded and the City will be the recipient of \$1,000,000; which a large part would be dedicated to the landscaping. Dave Allison expressed his gratitude in regard to how the project is being handled by the City and requested that the Council be cognizant of choosing a contractor that has the ability to complete the project in a timely manner. After further discussion, roll was called on the motion with the following results. Council Members voting aye: Kuntz, McGrath, Rothleutner, Carsrud, Carter-King, Jerred, and Mayor Opseth. The Presiding Officer declared the motion carried.

It was moved by Councilwoman Carter-King and seconded by Councilman Rothleutner to approve a twelve (12) month extension to the unrecorded plat agreement for the Pronghorn Ranch, Phase 2 Subdivision, from Thomas Civin on behalf of Pronghorn Ranch Properties, LLC. Mayor Opseth asked for discussion. There was none. Roll was called on the motion with the following results. Council Members voting aye: McGrath, Rothleutner, Carsrud, Carter-King, Jerred, Kuntz, and Mayor Opseth. The Presiding Officer declared the motion carried.

Administrator's Report

Mayor Opseth asked for an Administrator's Report. City Administrator Napier reported there was none.

Special Orders of the Day

Mayor Opseth opened into a public hearing in regard to a zoning map amendment for Lot 1, Full Moon Addition, from C-1, General Commercial District, to I-1, Light Industrial District. No comments were made and Mayor Opseth closed the public hearing.

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND THE DISTRICT ZONING MAP OF THE CITY OF GILLETTE, WYOMING, FOR PROPERTY GENERALLY LOCATED AT 3851 SOUTH GARNER LAKE ROAD AND LEGALLY DESCRIBED AS LOT 1, FULL MOON ADDITION, FROM C-1, GENERAL COMMERCIAL DISTRICT, TO I-1, LIGHT INDUSTRIAL DISTRICT, SUBJECT TO ALL PLANNING REQUIREMENTS It was moved by Councilman Rothleutner and seconded by Councilwoman Carter-King to approve the foregoing Ordinance on first reading. Mayor Opseth asked for discussion. There was none. Roll was called on the motion with the following results.
