The Presiding Officer declared the motion carried.

It was moved by Councilwoman Carter-King and seconded by Councilman Rothleutner to approve a contiguous pre-annexation agreement for emergency water service with Marlene Fetty for property located at 1110 Country Club Road. Mayor Opseth asked for discussion. There was none. Roll was called on the motion with the following results. Council Members voting aye: Kuntz, McGrath, Rothleutner, Carsrud, Carter-King, Jerred, and Mayor Opseth. The Presiding Officer declared the motion carried.
