Ordinance Second Reading

ORDINANCE 15-06

AN ORDINANCE TO RECODIFY AND GENERALLY REVISE CHAPTER 19 OF THE GILLETTE CITY CODE TO REVISE THE LICENSING AND REGULATION OF PUBLIC TRANSPORTATION, TAXICABS AND VEHICLES FOR HIRE

It was moved by Councilman Rothleutner and seconded by Councilman Jerred to approve the foregoing Ordinance on second reading. It was moved by Councilman Barks and seconded by Councilman Rothleutner to

amend the foregoing Ordinance with the following four amendments: 1) Section 19.2(10) be amended to include proof of unemployment and worker's compensation insurance as part of the application process to state: "A copy of the "Certificate of Good Standing" or other document demonstrating the applicant's registration with Wyoming Division of Workforce Services, regarding Worker's Compensation Insurance and Unemployment Insurance"; 2) Section 19.2(11) be included as an entirely new subsection to state: "Such other and further information or documentation as may be reasonably requested from the chief of police or the city clerk"; 3) the second, third and fourth paragraphs of Section 19.3(C) be stricken and amended in their entirety to read as follows: "The chief of police, upon completion of the background investigation, may recommend the city clerk disapprove any initial or renewal application if: the application contains incomplete, false or misleading information; the applicant has during the three (3) year period prior to the date of application suffered the loss of the privilege to drive a motor vehicle; the applicant has during the five (5) year period prior to the date of application been convicted of driving while under the influence of alcohol; the applicant has during the five (5) year period prior to the date of application been convicted of any offense related to controlled substances; the applicant has ever been convicted of any crime of violence; the applicant has ever been convicted of, or plead no contest to, any sex crime as set forth in Wyoming Statute 6-2-301 et seq. or similar laws of another State; the applicant has ever been convicted of any other felony, and it is reasonably believed by the chief of police that such a felony conviction could place any passenger's health, safety or general welfare in jeopardy, or such issuance would be contrary to the public interest"; 4)Section 19.3(D) be included as an entirely new subsection to state: "Any denial of Public Transportation Driver's Permit by the city clerk may be appealed to the City Administrator as otherwise provided in §19.9(c)". Mayor Carter-King asked for discussion. There was none. Roll was called on motion to amend with the following results. Council Members voting aye: Carsrud, Jerred, McGrath, Rothleutner, Barks and Mayor Carter-King. The Presiding Officer declared the motion carried and the Ordinance amended. Roll was called on the original motion with the following results. Council Members voting aye: Barks, Carsrud, Jerred, McGrath, Rothleutner, and Mayor Carter-King. The Presiding Officer declared the motion carried.

New Business

It was moved by Councilman McGrath and seconded by Councilman Rothleutner to approve a professional services agreement for construction management services associated with the Pavement Management System 2015 Schedule A Project with Morrison - Maierle, Inc., in the amount of \$195,223 (1% Project). Mayor Carter-King asked for an explanation of the request. City Administrator Napier explained that this project involves reconstructing the surface of Boxelder Road from Hwy 59 to the area around Home Depot. Mr. Napier added this is a 90 day project with regard to Boxelder Road specifically, and staff is hoping to be completed with the project the first of August. After the explanation, roll was called on the motion with the following results. Council Members voting aye: Jerred, McGrath, Rothleutner, Barks, Carsrud, and Mayor Carter-King. The Presiding Officer declared the motion carried.

It was moved by Councilman Rothleutner and seconded by Councilman Carsrud to approve a bid award for the base bid and alternates 1 and 2 for the Fox Park - Park Improvements and Arley Acres Pathway Project to DRM, Inc., in the amount of \$521,575.57 (1% Project). Mayor Carter-King asked for discussion. Councilman McGrath asked if this will take care of the Fox Park area. City Administrator Napier confirmed it is with regard to the park aspect of the project that

has been discussed with the community. Mr. Napier explained the one percent project and added that staff is recommending the base bid, as well as the alternates, be approved. Alternate 1 includes irrigation design to the existing trees, and alternate 2 includes wood chips and a trail around the park. After the discussion, roll was called on the motion with the following results. Council Members voting aye: McGrath, Rothleutner, Barks, Carsrud, Jerred, and Mayor Carter-King. The Presiding Officer declared the motion carried.

It was moved by Councilman Rothleutner and seconded by Councilman McGrath to approve a bid award for the base bid and alternate 1 for Parking Lot Rehabilitation Project to Powder River the Construction, Inc., in the amount of \$271,632.75 (1% Project). Mayor Carter-King asked for an explanation of the request. City Administrator Napier explained that this is a parking lot rehabilitation project for parking lots used for the dumping of debris after the winter storm event that occurred two years ago. The parking lots involved are McManamen Park, Hidden Valley Park and Dalbey Park. Alternate 1 consists of asphalt patching and curb and gutter work on the west end of the Little League parking lot at Dalbey Park. After the explanation, roll was called on the motion with the following results. Council Members voting aye: Rothleutner, Barks, Carsrud, Jerred, McGrath, and Mayor Carter-King. The Presiding Officer declared the motion carried.

It was moved by Councilman Rothleutner and seconded by Councilman Barks to approve a professional services agreement for construction management services associated with the Parking Lot Rehabilitation Project with Consolidated Engineers, Inc., in the amount of \$48,512.05 (1% Project). Mayor Carter-King asked for an explanation of the request. City Administrator Napier explained that this request is for the oversight of the previous item that was discussed, which is also funded through One Percent. After the explanation, roll was called on the motion with the following results. Council Members voting aye: Barks, Carsrud, Jerred, McGrath, Rothleutner, and Mayor Carter-King. The Presiding Officer declared the motion carried.

It was moved by Councilman Carsrud and seconded by Councilman Rothleutner to accept subdivision improvements for the Tenth Hole Estates Phase 2 Subdivision, installed by DRM, Inc., on behalf of the developer, Gillette Land Development III. Mayor Carter-King asked for discussion. There was none. Roll was called on the motion with the following results. Council Members voting aye: Carsrud, Jerred, McGrath, Rothleutner, Barks, and Mayor Carter-King. The Presiding Officer declared the motion carried.

It was moved by Councilman Rothleutner and seconded by Councilman Carsrud to approve the County final plat for the resubdivision of Lots 2 and 3, Concho Valley Estates, to be known as Lots 2A and 3A, Concho Valley Estates, subject to all Planning requirements. Mayor Carter-King asked for discussion. There was none. Roll was called on the motion with the following results. Council Members voting aye: Jerred, McGrath, Rothleutner, Barks, Carsrud, and Mayor Carter-King. The Presiding Officer declared the motion carried.

It was moved by Councilman McGrath and seconded by Councilman Rothleutner to approve Amendment No. 5 to the 2009 Project Funding Agreement for grant funding for the Gillette Madison Pipeline Project with the State of Wyoming Water Development Commission in the amount of \$13,385,995, as authorized by the 2014 Wyoming State Legislature. Mayor Carter-King asked for an explanation of the request. City Administrator Napier explained that this is the process the state requires for the deployment of funds allocated into project and project awards relating to the Madison Pipeline

Project. Council will see another amendment for the 2015 appropriation that should be the final appropriation from the State. After the discussion, roll was called on the motion with the following results. Council Members voting aye: McGrath, Rothleutner, Barks, Carsrud, Jerred, and Mayor Carter-King. The Presiding Officer declared the motion carried. Administrator's Report

Mayor Carter-King asked for an Administrator's Report. City Administrator Napier reported there was none.

Special Orders of the Day

Mayor Carter-King opened a public hearing to amend the zoning ordinance of the City of Gillette, Wyoming, to amend Section 6.n.(10), permitted right-of-way encroachments in the C-2 Central Business District (Gillette Avenue Outdoor Serving and Sales).

ORDINANCE 15-07

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND THE ZONING ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF GILLETTE, WYOMING, TO AMEND SECTION 6. N. (10), PERMITTED RIGHT-OF-WAY ENCROACHMENTS IN THE C-2, CENTRAL BUSINESS DISTRICT (GILLETTE AVENUE OUTDOOR SERVING AND SALES)

It was moved by Councilman Rothleutner and seconded by Councilman Jerred to approve the foregoing Ordinance on first reading. Mayor Carter-King asked for an explanation of the request. City Administrator Napier explained this Ordinance will allow outdoor service specifically, and exclusively on Gillette Avenue. Mr. Napier explained the zero depth lot lines located on Gillette Avenue, and how this Ordinance will designate the encroachment on public right-of-way for the serving of alcohol and food. After the explanation, roll was called on the motion with the following results. Council Members voting aye: Rothleutner, Barks, Carsrud, Jerred, McGrath, and Mayor Carter-King. The Presiding Officer declared the motion carried.
