

COUNCIL PROCEEDINGS

Special Meeting

October 27, 2015

5:35 p.m.

A Special meeting of the City Council of the City of Gillette, County of Campbell, State of Wyoming, was held on Tuesday the 27th day of October 2015, in the 3rd floor conference room, pursuant to due notice and call. The Presiding Officer called the meeting to order and upon roll call the following were found to be present:

Council Members present: Tim Carsrud, Ted Jerred, Robin Kuntz, Dan Barks, and Mayor Louise Carter-King.

Council Member absent: Kevin McGrath.

Staff present: J. Carter Napier, City Administrator; Charlie Anderson, City Attorney; Patrick Davidson, Asst. City Attorney; Patti Davidsmeier, Community & Government Relations Manager; and Karlene Abelseth, City Clerk.

Warm Up Items

Councilman Kuntz reported a conversation he had regarding the crosswalks near the Y.E.S. House. There is no flashing beacon allowing notification to on-coming vehicles that the crosswalk is occupied with a pedestrian. He asked staff to look into this matter and see what could be done.

Councilman Carsrud reported of a cement wall that Rapid City, South Dakota, had erected to be used for art and/or graffiti purposes. He asked if there would be interest in erecting a cement wall in the city of Gillette to be used for this same purpose. Community & Gov't Relations Manager Davidsmeier stated that she would check with the Mayor's Art Council Board and possibly put this matter on the agenda.

Mayor Carter-King thanked Councilman Barks for all his work regarding a billboard on Hwy 59 and 4th Street. Councilman Barks informed the group that the message he received from Michael VonFlattern was the sign would be removed, however, there needs to be support in bringing awareness to the community. Councilman Barks contacted several health officials and he will be attending a meeting to discuss what can be done.

Executive Session

It was moved by Councilman Carsrud and seconded by Councilman Barks to move into an Executive Session to discuss real estate, personnel, and security. Mayor Carter-King asked for discussion. There was none. Roll was called on the motion with the following results. Council Members voting aye: Barks, Carsrud, Jerred, Kuntz, and Mayor Carter-King.
