Dear Dustin:

Below please find a list of outstanding warrantable items that have been noted as being needed to be addressed during the warranty period.

- 1. Flashing around entire perimeter of building at intersection of CMU wainscot and siding. Sealant has failed in many locations, causing flashing to pull up at front edge of metal. Flashing slopes negatively toward building. Contractor to propose and execute permanent solution to issue.
- 2. Seeding has failed at area north of sodded area. Contractor to reseed as necessary.
- 3. Exterior doors are not operating properly. Ongoing issues include but are not limited to hardware and security operation of doors.
- 4. Rust is forming on trash enclosure steel in parking lot. It appears that there is inadequate paint coverage. Contractor will remove rust and repaint as necessary.
