

A Pre-Meeting of the City Council was held on Tuesday the 1st day of May 2018.

Present were Councilmen Barks, Carsrud, Kuntz, Lundvall, Montgomery, Neary, and Mayor Carter-King; City Administrator Davidson; City Attorney Reyes; Directors Cole, VonEye and Wilde; Lt. Deaton; Managers Palazzari and Toscana; and Deputy City Clerk Staskiewicz.

Warm Up Items

Councilman Montgomery commended Mayor Carter-King, Arborist Clements, and the Parks Department for the recent Arbor Day celebration.

Councilman Barks reminded Council of the upcoming Trash-A-Thon event, which would be a joint cleanup effort of the Parks Board and the City Council, with the possibility of the assistance of the County Commissioners.

Public Works Director Wilde reported that participation in the Drive & Drop program has been higher than previous years, indicating a very successful event, thus far, with one weekend remaining. Director Wilde informed Council that final event statistics should be available a few weeks after the completion of the event.

Gillette College Funding

Dr. Mark Englert, Gillette College Vice President and CEO, expressed gratitude to the City for the funding provided for the college. He informed Council of the positive affects the funding has had on the College, and encouraged the Council to consider the proposed increase in 1% funds, along with continuation of Council's support.

Quarterly Update – Energy Capital Economic Development

Phil Christopherson, CEO of the Energy Capital Economic Development, updated Council on economic development progress made throughout Campbell County within the last quarter.

Wireless Communications Facilities Ordinance

Development Services Director VonEye gave a presentation explaining the upcoming Zoning Ordinance amendment of Section 13, regarding wireless communication facilities. Brian Worthen of Visionary Communications spoke in support of the amended Ordinance. Director VonEye advised that the first reading of the Ordinance would be considered on the upcoming Council agenda; the second reading of the Ordinance would require an amendment to reorganize the flow of the Ordinance to enhance clarity of the contents.
