Warm Up Items

Councilman Montgomery commended Mayor Carter-King for the fine job she did at the Children's Memorial Walkway Ceremony; Councilman Kuntz reported on the recent horse racing at Cam-Plex; Mayor Carter-King stated, in light of the recent tornado, she would like to send the Commissioners a letter, withdrawing the City's request to waive tipping fees for the Drive and Drop event. Council was in agreement; Acting Administrator Wilde reported on the upcoming tournaments; a video of Xprize was presented.

Campbell County Convention and Visitors Bureau Funding Request

Mary Silvernell and Terry Sjolin reported that the CCCVB has been marketing to Sports Tourism Planners, concentrating on sporting events as a major traveler segment to Campbell County. The CCCVB has wanted to purchase a Sports Tourism Assessment and Strategy Study. Funds were budgeted in FY2018-2019, but not enough to cover all the costs to complete a study. The County Commissioners approved \$10,000 towards the study's total project costs of \$31,000, and she is requesting funding support of \$10,000 from the City, as well. Discussion ensued. After the discussion, it was the consensus of the Council to fund \$10,000 towards the study.
