## WYDOT State Transportation Improvement Plan Presentation

Wyoming Department of Transportation employees, Laura Dalles, Public Involvement Specialist; Mark Gillett, Assistant Chief Engineer; Scott Taylor, District Engineer; and James Evensen, District Construction Engineer presented information on 2018 funding sources, State Transportation Improvement Program (STIP) 6-year development and overview, district projects, and partnership opportunities. Councilman Kuntz inquired about the timeline for the protected turn on Lakeway Road and Highway 59 and received a response of a projected completion date of the fall of 2018. Mayor Carter-King inquired about a timeline for the traffic signals on Garner Lake Road and Boxelder Road received a response that the traffic signals are scheduled for completion in 2019. Discussion ensued regarding various projects and problem areas in the Gillette area. Mark Gillett informed Council that government agencies can partner with the State of Wyoming for bids on construction supplies, fuel, road salt, sand and aggregate, bulk sodium chloride, crack sealing materials, etc. Ordering in larger quantities can result in savings for both the State and the City.

## **Budget Amendment Review**

City Administrator Davidson gave Council an overview of the FY2017-2018 budget amendment, noting that for the most part, the amendment is mainly for bookkeeping purposes rather than actual dollars.
