

Please except this letter as a request for our proposed extended servicing area. We would like this matter to be placed on the City Council's December 4th meeting agenda, for review and approval. The area is approximately 5393 square feet, on the east side of the building. This area includes our horse shoe pits and corn hole boards. Area does not include, as some have thought, the receiving bay/loading dock or the locked back receiving door of the Shell Food Mart. See attachment for clarity. I have attached an email from Mr. Patrick Davidson, from November of 2017, regarding the plans Alex Gilmour of Denali Construction presented him regarding the proposed split rail/cross buck fence. Mr. Davidson stated, "It would appear, based on the information provided, that the proposed project would constitute a fence for the purposes of the Wyoming Statues and our City Code Chapter 3." A permit for the fence was received March 4th, 2018 and the fence was built by Mr. Gilmour using attached drawing that was presented to Mr. Davidson. After Mr. Gilmour finished construction of the fence, he called the City and requested an inspection. He was informed that the City does not inspect fences. The fence was modified, by Michael's Construction while the drive through was being constructed, to enclose the approximately 5393 square feet we are requesting. Mr. Joe Schoen from the City Engineering Department inspected and approved the drive through and fence on November 1st, 2018, according to Mike Jorgensen of Michael's Construction.

Mr. Kurtenbach:

I had an opportunity to meet with Mr. Gilmour with regard to a fence for your business known as Legend's. It would appear, based on the information provided, that the proposed project would constitute a fence for purposes of the Wyoming Statutes and our City Code Chapter 3. Mr. Gilmour and I also discussed a "temporary" fence to enclose the smoking area, and the permanent type fence more along the boundaries of where horseshoes, etc. were played. I feel pretty confident as to what has been proposed.

However, I want to be clear that my interpretation of the fence is simply my own. The ability to serve outdoors, and to allow you to expand the licensed building is entirely at Council's discretion. They are not required to accept your proposal as meeting either the City Code requirements or Wyoming Statutes. Even with the fence, and the construction of the same, the decision to expand your licensed building to include anything outside of the four walls of your building is subject to Council's sole discretion.

I mentioned to Mr. Gilmour that I would forward this information regarding the fence to you. As always, if you have additional questions or concerns, please do not hesitate to contact Karlene, Tony or myself.
