Gillette College Quarterly Update

Gillette College Vice President Janell Oberlander introduced the Women's Basketball Team Head Coach, Liz Lewis. Councilman (Coach) Neary informed Council that this will be the 11th season of Gillette College Basketball, and commented on the tremendous support received from the community over the years. He stated that Gillette College has a state of the art facility, especially for junior college level. He welcomed Liz Lewis to the staff.
