Comments

Council Comments – Councilman Carsrud stated that he received positive comments from a Northern California family, visiting Gillette for the recent Energy Classic Basketball Tournament, noting how everyone in the area was so kind, friendly, and genuine.

Councilman Lundvall informed of a \$10,000 funding contribution by the Kiwanis Club, for use at the Energy Capital Sports Complex for sensory-purposed playground equipment in the proposed all-inclusive park area. Councilman Lundvall thanked the Kiwanis Club for their contribution, and commended their continued involvement in the community.

Other Comments – Communications Manager Palazzari gave a video presentation of community events and information.

New Business – Minute Action

Council Montgomery made a motion to designate the Gillette News Record as the City's official newspaper for calendar year 2020; seconded by Councilman Brown. Administrator Davidson explained the consideration. All voted aye. The motion carried.

Councilman Lundvall made a motion to designate bank depositories for public funds of the City of Gillette for the calendar year 2020; seconded by Councilman Carsrud. Administrator Davidson explained that the annual designation includes the following institutions that have applied and met the City and State requirements for depositories: US Bank, First National Bank, Security State Bank, Bank of Gillette, 1st Northern Bank of Wyoming, Pinnacle Bank, 1st Interstate Bank, and American National Bank. Administrator Davidson clarified that the City is not obligated to utilize each bank, the annual designation grants the authority to do so. All voted aye. The motion carried.

RESOLUTION NO. 2716

A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING SUBMISSION OF AN APPLICATION TO THE WYOMING PARKS AND CULTURAL RESOURCES COMMISSION UNDER THE LAND AND WATER CONSERVATION FUND FOR THE GOVERNING BODY OF THE CITY OF GILLETTE, WYOMING, FOR THE PURPOSE OF THE ENERGY CAPITAL SPORTS COMPLEX ENHANCEMENT PROJECT.

Councilman Carsrud made a motion to approve the foregoing Resolution authorizing the submission of an application to the Wyoming Parks and Cultural Resources Commission under the Land and Water Conservation Fund for the governing body of the City of Gillette, Wyoming, for the purpose of the Energy Capital Sports Complex Enhancement Project; seconded by Councilman Brown. Administrator Davidson explained the consideration and stated that the funds, if awarded, would not become available until after October 1st. All voted aye. The motion carried.

Councilman McLeland made a motion to accept public improvements for the 2019 Sanitary Sewer Main Replacement Project, installed by Hot Iron, Inc., in the amount of \$650,256.41 (1% Project); seconded by

Councilman Montgomery. Administrator Davidson explained the consideration. All voted aye. The motion carried.

Councilman Montgomery made a motion to approve the item moved from the Consent Agenda, Bills and Claims, to the General Agenda, as requested by Councilman Brown; seconded by Councilman Brown. Mayor Carter-King stated that the Bills and Claims item is in the amount of \$20,000,000. City Administrator Davidson explained that the City of Gillette maintains reserve funds in a few different accounts. Historically, the City has used WYOSTAR to manage some of the funds. The City will now be utilizing WYGIF for the management of some of the funds, pursuant to the PFM Asset Management recommendation, as additional ways for the City to manage long-term reserve funds. The \$20,000,000, as listed on the Bills and Claims, is not technically an expenditure of funds, but is a transfer of funds between investment savings accounts. All voted aye. The motion carried.

Appointments

Council President Montgomery made a motion to appoint Councilman Shawn Neary as Council President for the 2020 calendar year; seconded by Councilman Brown. All voted aye. The motion carried.

Councilman Montgomery made a motion to appoint Patrick G. Davidson as City Administrator for the 2020 calendar year; seconded by Councilman Brown. All voted aye. The motion carried.

Councilman Montgomery made a motion to appoint Anthony M. Reyes as City Attorney for the 2020 calendar year; seconded by Councilman Carsrud. All voted aye. The motion carried.

Councilman Montgomery made a motion to appoint R. Douglas Dumbrill as Municipal Court Judge for the 2020 calendar year; seconded by Councilman Lundvall. Brown, Carsrud, Lundvall, Montgomery, and Mayor Carter-King voted aye. Councilman McLeland abstained. The motion carried.

Councilman Montgomery made a motion to appoint Christopher R. Ringer as the at-will Municipal Prosecutor for the City of Gillette, Wyoming, for the 2020 calendar year; seconded by Councilman Brown. All voted aye. The motion carried.

Rachelle Woodford explained their business intentions. Mayor Carter-King closed the public hearing.

Councilman Montgomery made a motion to approve the transfer of retail liquor license RTL-20 from Montgomery Bar & Hotel, Inc., d.b.a. Montgomery Bar, located at 100 South Gillette Avenue, to LMM

Enterprises, LLC, d.b.a. Montgomery Bar, located at 100 South Gillette Avenue; seconded by Councilman Brown. All voted aye. The motion carried.
